HTML Improvements

It's the little things that make a big difference. These 7 HTML snippets will help you add the finishing touches to your web projects and make them stand out amongst the rest!

Viewport



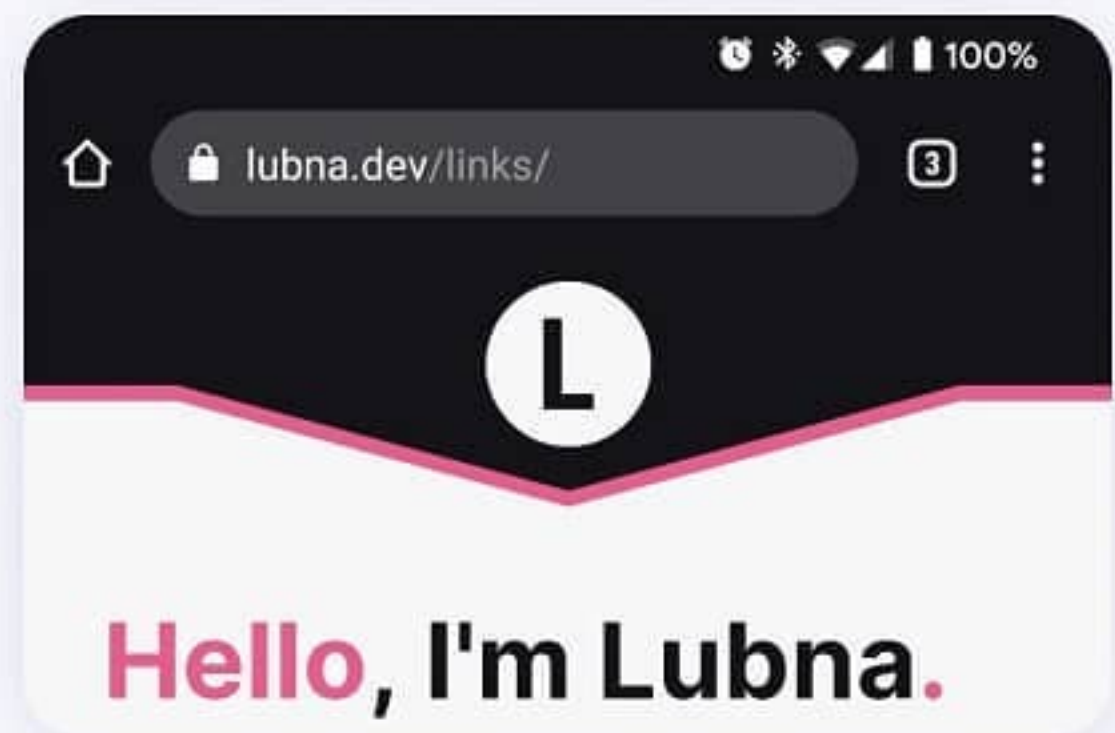
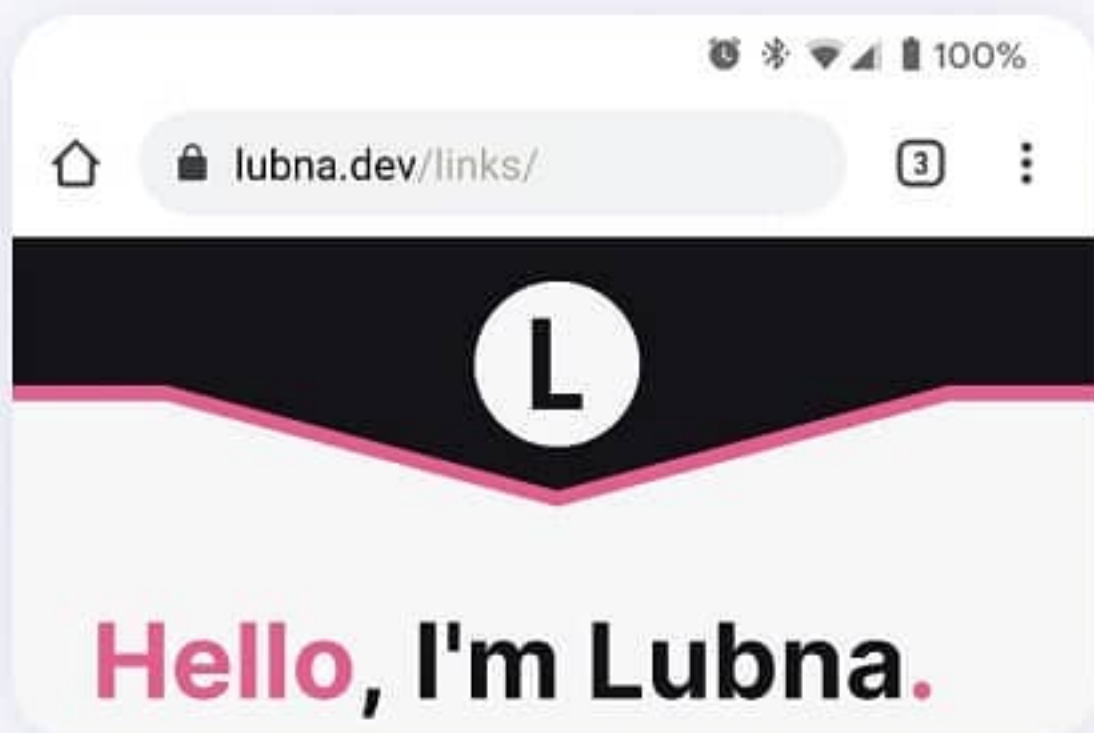
Responsive pages are a must so no page is complete without this viewport tag.

```
<meta  
  name="viewport"  
  content="width=device-width, initial-scale=1.0"  
>
```

Theme colour

Add an extra touch of branding by customizing the colour of the mobile browser header.

```
<meta name="theme-color" content="#141318" />
```



Charset



In order to avoid any special characters showing up incorrectly make sure to specify the charset.

```
<meta charset="UTF-8" />
```

Noopener & noreferrer



For extra security add noopener and noreferrer to all external links.

```
<a  
  href="https://lubna.dev"  
  rel="noopener noreferrer"  
  target="_blank"  
>  
  External Link  
</a>
```

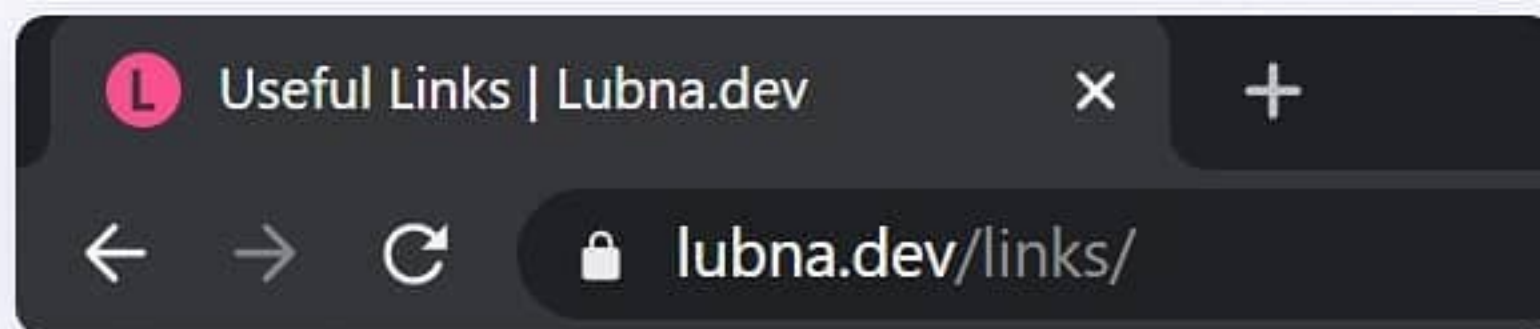
This prevents the external page gaining any access to the original page and also won't pass any referrer information to the external page.

Favicon



Add a favicon for a bit of branding in tabs & bookmarks.

```
<link rel="icon" type="image/png" href="icon.png" />
```



Top tip: check that your icon is visible with light and dark mode in the browser.

Touch icons



Slightly different code to add the favicon on mobile (also used if the page is added to the home screen).

```
<link rel="apple-touch-icon" sizes="48x48"
      href="touch-icon-48.png" />

<link rel="apple-touch-icon" sizes="72x72"
      href="touch-icon-48.png" />

<link rel="apple-touch-icon" sizes="96x96"
      href="touch-icon-48.png" />
```

It works for apple and android devices and you can add as many sizes as you need.

Image srcset

Include multiple image sizes so the browser can pick the best one based on the device size.

```
